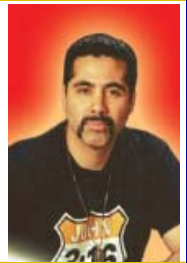

## So That Our Joy May Be Complete

What began by John Paul II in the early 1980's as an invitation to young people, ages 18 -35, to attend an International Jubilee of Youth in St. Peter's Square has grown to be the single largest, international gathering of young people the world has ever seen. In 1984 more than 300,000 young people from all over the world responded to his invitation. Today the size and scale of WYD exceeds that of the Olympic Games or the Rugby World Cup. In Cologne, Germany, host of the last international WYD in 2005, over 1.2 million people attended the Final Mass. WYD attracts pilgrims from some 200 nations. YAM is leading a pilgrimage to the 'Land Down Under' to experience this universal meeting of young Catholics from around the world. Here's a little excerpt about the World Youth Day experience as taken from the WYD website ([www.wyd2008.org](http://www.wyd2008.org)):

"World Youth Day is the largest youth event in the world and will be held in Sydney from 15-20 July 2008. Organized by the Catholic Church, World Youth Day gathers young people from around the world to build bridges of friendship and hope between continents, peoples and cultures. In August 2005, Sydney was chosen to host the XXIII World Youth Day. The announcement was made by Pope Benedict XVI in Cologne at the conclusion of the XX World Youth Day in August 2005.

Through the WYD08 experience, young people from throughout the world will make a pilgrimage in faith, meet, and experience the love of God. The young people will have an opportunity to rediscover their baptismal calling and the centrality of the sacraments of the Eucharist and reconciliation, and so discover a new apostolic zeal to witness more fully the Gospel in the modern world. All in the context of the beauty of Australia and the hospitality of the Australian people!

The WYD08 theme, received from The Holy Father is: ***'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses.'*** Acts 1:8 This passage occurs after the death and resurrection of Jesus, just before his ascension to the Father. It represents the birth of the Church.

The disciples had questioned Jesus about the time of the restoration of Israel. His words 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you' were somewhat surprising - they referred to a new meaning of the word "power". Jesus promises a different kind of "power" to help the Jews from under the yoke of Roman occupation. The power He promises to give is the very Spirit of God, the dynamic potential for transformation, the very condition of living according to the manner of Jesus' life.

This Spirit is not a vague ambiguous force, rather it is a Divine Person, the true Self Gift of the Father to the Son, and the Son to the Father, and hence the gift of the Father to us in the Son - with Him we say "Our Father". Only with the reception of the Spirit of Jesus can we exercise the authentic passion of the Heart of Christ, and hence by being set on fire with it do we as persons become witnesses to Him and everything for which He stands.

The ultimate witness we can make is to follow in the pattern of His life through the total self gift of our lives, lived authentically in truth and love for Him and at the service of others."

Twenty young adults from the Archdiocese of Atlanta will attend World Youth Day in Sydney, Australia. While our pilgrimage is at full capacity, we invite you to join us spiritually through your prayers as we journey to the "Southern Land of the Holy Spirit."

## ALL SAINTS DAY

Nov 1

On All Saints Day, Catholics honor and pray for the intercession of canonized saints and celebrate the communion of saints—all the baptized in heaven, purgatory, and on earth.

On All Souls Day, Catholics pray for those souls in purgatory, that they may be hurried along the path to heaven.

As Catholics, we pray for the intercession of the saints in heaven to help us in our earthly lives. All Saints Day is essentially a celebration of the lives and deaths of all the saints, especially the lesser-known ones who don't earn frequent mention, and all who are included in the communion of saints canonized or not.

It is a day to remember our beloved dead, especially those who passed in the last year. At many parishes, a list of the deceased from the past year is included in the litany of saints.

Catholics believe in the communion of the saints, that all of the baptized in heaven, purgatory, and on Earth remain connected and are part of the one Body of Christ. Theologian Elizabeth Johnson calls All Saints Day the "festival par excellence of the communion of saints, giving comfort and consolation to those who are grieving the loss of beloved persons and awakening in all community members hope and joy in their solidarity with the friends of God and prophets of all ages.
